Federal Agency Speaker Bios

Michael W. Burns, Senior Advisor to the Regional Administrator/National Director of the College Underserved Community Partnership Program, EPA Region 4

Over the last twenty plus years in the federal government, Mr. Burns has been a Supervisor of Environmental Engineers; a Chief of Facilities for the Southeast Region of the National Park Service; a Director of Regional Public Works for the U.S. Army; Deputy Director of Base Operations for the Army Reserve; and an Executive Director for the Southeast Region of the U.S. Navy. Mr. Burns is currently a Senior Advisor for the Regional Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency, Region 4, and the National Director of the College/Underserved Community Partnership Program (CUPP), which he created in 2011.

Thurmond Tillman, Partnership Specialist, U.S. Census Bureau

Thurmond N. Tillman currently serves as a Partnership Specialist for the Atlanta Region of the U. S. Census Bureau. He served as a Senior Partnership Specialist and Team Leader in Georgia during the 2010 and 2000 Censuses and as a Community Awareness Specialist in the 1990 Census. Tillman received a Bachelor of Science degree in Sociology with an emphasis in Criminal Justice and a minor in Business Management from the University of West Georgia in Carrollton, Georgia. He also attended and graduated from the Interdenominational Theological Center - Morehouse School of Religion, Atlanta, Georgia where he received a Masters in Divinity degree with a dual concentration in Bible and Christian Education.

Joyce White, State Director, USDA Rural Development

Joyce White was named State Director of the USDA Rural Development in Georgia by the Trump Administration on November 27, 2017. In this capacity, she coordinates the efforts of 95 employees to work with others to ensure use of resources and 40 + programs are serving rural Georgia residents. As State Director, White is using her leadership experience to oversee Rural Development programs in a customer-focused manner to restore prosperity in rural Georgia.
