Legislative Days 17-18

The General Assembly reconvened on Monday, February 24, and will be in session all five days this week. With only ten legislative days remaining until Crossover Day (LD 28), both chambers have entered a period of high activity as more and more bills make their way through the legislative process.

As provided for in <u>HR 1170</u>, Chief Justice Harold D. Melton <u>will deliver his second State of the Judiciary</u> address Wednesday, February 26 (LD 19) at 11:00 a.m. in the House chamber. The speech will be available via livestream at https://www.gpb.org/lawmakers/2020/state-of-the-judiciary.

Both chambers stand adjourned until Wednesday, February 26, at 10:00 a.m. for Legislative Day 19.

HB 113 - Motor vehicles; prohibit license and instruction permit holders from using a stand-alone electronic

Sponsor: Rep. John Carson (R – Marietta)

Action: HB 113 received Do Pass by Substitute from the House Public Safety & Homeland Security

Committee (2/24/2020).

<u>HB 417 - Law enforcement officers and agencies; comprehensive regulation of trauma scene cleanup</u> services; provide

Sponsor: Rep. Alan Powell (R – Hartwell)

Actions: HB 417 passed the House with a vote of 147-19 (2/24/2020).

HB 664 - Georgia Judicial Retirement System; membership for certain persons employed in certain full time positions requiring admission to the State Bar of Georgia as a condition of employment; require

Sponsor: Rep. Barry Fleming (R – Harlem)

Actions: HB 664 passed out of House Rules (2/24/2020); and, passed the House with a vote of 154-0 (2/25/2020).

HB 719 - Crimes and offenses; modernization of HIV related laws; provide

Sponsor: Rep. Deborah Silcox (R – Sandy Springs)

Action: HB 719 received a Do Pass by Substitute from the House Health & Human Services Committee (2/25/2020).

HB 765 - Courts; increase in the minimum compensation for chief magistrates; provide

Sponsor: Rep. Mitchell Scoggins (R – Cartersville)

Action: HB 765 received a Do Pass from the Senate State & Local Governmental Operations Committee (2/25/2020).

HB 787 - Crimes and offenses; weapons carry license reciprocity in this state; expand

Sponsor: Rep. Mandi Ballinger (R – Canton)

Action: HB 787 received a Do Pass from the House Public Safety & Homeland Security Committee (2/24/2020).

HB 859 - Motor vehicles; tinting of windows of windshields; provide maximum monetary penalty

Sponsor: Rep. Clay Pirkle (R – Ashburn)

Action: HB 859 received a Do Pass from the House Public Safety & Homeland Security Committee (2/24/2020).

HB 890 - Drivers' licenses; notices of revocation and suspension by regular mail; provide

Sponsor: Rep. Sam Watson (R – Moultrie)

Action: HB 890 received a Do Pass from the House Motor Vehicles Committee (2/25/2020).

HB 967 - Columbus, City of; Municipal Court; provide that the sheriff of Muscogee County shall be the ex officio marshal of said court

Sponsor: Rep. Vance Smith (R – Pine Mountain)

Actions: HB 967 passed the House on the Local Calendar with a vote of 157-0 (2/25/2020).

HB 968 - Civil practice; clarify actions that may be brought pursuant to Code Section 9-3-51 regarding deficiencies in connection with improvements to realty

Sponsor: Rep. Chuck Efstration (R – Dacula)

Action: HB 968 received a Do Pass by Substitute from the House Judiciary Civil Committee (2/25/2020).

HB 969 - Housing; certain provisions pertaining to unlawful practices in selling or renting dwellings and the procedures, remedies, and judicial review related thereto; change

Sponsor: Rep. Chuck Efstration (R – Dacula)

Action: HB 969 received a Do Pass from the House Judiciary Civil Committee (2/25/2020).

HB 987 - Health; additional measures for the protection of elderly persons; provide

Sponsor: Rep. Sharon Cooper (R – Marietta)

Action: HB 987 received a Do Pass from the House Health & Human Services Committee (2/25/2020).

HB 1003 - Ogeechee Judicial Circuit; provide additional judge of the superior courts

Action: HB 1003 received a Do Pass a from the House Judiciary Civil Committee (2/25/2020).

SB 357 - Firearms; carry weapons in places of worship and in schools operated by such places of worship; revise the ability

SB 375 - Cigarettes and Tobacco Related Products; additional penalties regarding any person under 21 years of age; provide; definition of vapor product; revise

Action: No action was taken on SB 375 by the Senate Regulated Industries & Utilities Committee (2/25/2020).

SB 388 - General Income Tax Provisions; certain actions relating to false or fraudulent material matter on returns, affidavits, claims, or documents; penalties; increase

Sponsor: Sen. John Kennedy (R – Macon)

Action: SB 388 received a Do Pass from the Senate Judiciary Committee (2/24/2020).

SB 393 - Law Enforcement Officers and Agencies; duties and powers; revise; campus policemen and other security personnel of the university system; arrests for felony offenses

Sponsor: Sen. Brian Strickland (R – McDonough)

Action: SB 393 failed to receive a Do Pass from the Senate Public Safety Committee (2/24/2020).

SB 394 - Attorney General; authority to investigate and prosecute certain crimes and offenses; provide

Sponsor: Sen. John Albers (R – Roswell)

Action: SB 394 received a Do Pass by Substitute from the Senate Public Safety Committee (2/24/20).

SB 402 - Bonds and Recognizances; conditions for unsecured judicial release on a person's own recognizance; provide

Sponsor: Sen. Randy Robertson (R – Cataula)

Actions: SB 402 received a Do Pass from the Senate Public Safety Committee (2/24/2020).

SB 405 - Superior Courts of the Cobb Judicial Circuit; eleventh judge; provide
