

WEEKLY LEGISLATIVE REPORT

February 1, 2019

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Week 3 (Legislative Days 5-7)

The Georgia Legislature returned on Monday, January 28 for Legislative Day 5 and stayed in session until Wednesday, January 31 (LD 7). Little action was taken on the floor but committees in both chambers began to meet and pass out legislation.

Appropriations hearings were held between Tuesday, January 22 and Friday, January 25. The tracking documents for the <u>FY 2019 Amended</u> Budget and <u>FY 2020</u> Budget can be found by following their respective links.

One bill supported by the Judicial Council was introduced this week. <u>HB 92</u> would allow municipal court judges to roll over up to 6 excess annual training hours to the subsequent year. The House Judiciary Civl Committee met on Tuesday and passed <u>HB 21</u> and <u>HB 28</u>. These bills provide for an additional superior court judgeship in the Gwinnett and Griffin Judicial Circuits respectively.

On Wednesday, January 30 (LD 7), the House adopted <u>HR 97</u>, calling for a Joint Session on Tuesday, February 19 to hear Chief Justice Harold D. Melton present the State of the Judiciary Address.

The General Assembly will be in recess on Monday, February 4 and return on Tuesday, February 5 for Legislative Day 8.

The following legislation supported by the Judicial Council was filed this week:

HB 92 - Georgia Municipal Courts Training Council; training hours completed by a municipal court judge in excess of those required may carry over to the following year; provide

Sponsor: Rep. Dale Rutledge (R – McDonough)

HB 92 amends Title 36 of the O.C.G.A. to allow municipal court judges who complete training hours in excess of the annual requirement to request that up to six of those excess hours be rolled over and applied to the subsequent calendar year.

Action: HB 92 was assigned to the House Judiciary Civil Committee. (1/30/19)

SB 25 - Rules of the Road; when driver of a vehicle need not stop upon meeting or passing a school bus; clarify

Action: SB 25 received a Do Pass by Substitute by the Senate Public Safety Committee.
