WEEKLY LEGISLATIVE REPORT

February 9, 2018

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Week 5 (Legislative Days 15-18)

The fifth week of the 2018 legislative session was busy and productive. <u>HB 159</u> (adoption) received final passage on Monday while <u>HB 683</u>, the Amended Fiscal Year 2018 Budget, was passed out of the House on Tuesday, February 6. It now moves on to the Senate. The most up to date tracking document for the budget can be found <u>here</u>. Other bills and resolutions continued to make their way through committees and an increasing number are being passed on the floor by both chambers. With Crossover Day (LD 28) now less than three weeks away, this activity level should only increase as that date nears.

SB 406 and SB 407, the criminal justice reform bills, were filed on Thursday, February 8.

Both chambers will reconvene on Monday, February 12, for Legislative Day 19.

Floor and Committee Action

Legislation Supported by the Judicial Council

HB 571 - Magistrates Retirement Fund; member in arrears for dues payments for 90 days shall be suspended; provisions

Sponsor: Rep. Sam Watson (R – Moultrie)

HB 571 amends Title 47 of the O.C.G.A. to provide that if a member of the Magistrates Retirement Fund is in arrears for due payments for 90 days, they will become a suspended member. HB 571 further provides for a method for suspended members to apply for reinstatement into the fund. The bill also provides members with survivors benefit options.

Action: HB 571 was passed on to the floor by the House Rules Committee (2/6/18); and, was passed by the House with a vote of 159-0 (2/9/18).

HB 654 - Child support; reforms recommended by Ga. Child Support Commission; enact Sponsor: Rep. Beth Beskin (R – Atlanta)

HB 654 amends Code Section 19-6-15 of the O.C.G.A. The bill makes it discretionary to file multiple worksheets in cases with more than one child where one child may become ineligible for support over the next two years.

Action: HB 654 received a Do Pass from the House Judiciary Civil Fleming Subcommittee (2/5/18); and, received a Do Pass from the House Judiciary Civil Committee (2/6/18).

HB 119 - Employees' Retirement System of Georgia; member shall be eligible to transfer funds to Georgia Judicial Retirement System; provide

Sponsor: Rep. Trey Kelley (R – Cedartown)

Action: HB 119 was not heard by the House Retirement Committee. (2/7/18)

HB 121 - Trusts; minor or unborn beneficiaries; change provisions

Sponsor: Rep. Chuck Efstration (R – Dacula)

Action: HB 121 received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute from the House Judiciary Civil

Committee. (2/6/18)

HB 159 - Domestic relations; adoption; substantially revise general provisions

Sponsor: Rep. Bert Reeves (R – Marietta)

Action: The Senate Agreed to the House Amendment with a vote of 53-2 (2/5/18). Final

passage.

HB 381 - Abandoned Mobile Home Act; enact

Sponsor: Rep. John Corbett (R – Lake Park)

Action: HB 381 received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute from the House Judiciary Civil

Committee. (2/8/18)

Action: HB 505 failed to pass out of the House Judiciary Civil Fleming Subcommittee.

HB 618 - Skidaway Island, City of; incorporate

Sponsor Rep. Jessie Petrea (R – Savannah)

Action: HB 618 was passed out of House Rules (2/7/18); and, was passed by the House with a vote of 158-3. (2/8/18)

HB 657 - Firearms; providing to person on probation as a felony first offender; make unlawful

Sponsor: Rep. Jesse Petrea (R – Savannah)

Action: HB 657 received a Do Pass from the House Public Safety Committee. (2/5/18)

HB 668 - Guardian and ward; petitions for appointment of a guardian under certain circumstances; provisions

Sponsor: Rep. Betty Price (R – Roswell)

Action: HB 668 received a Do Pass by the House Judiciary Civil Committee. (2/6/18)

HB 670 - Georgia State Council for Interstate Juvenile Supervision; number of legislative branch representatives; revise

Sponsor: Rep. Alan Powell (R – Hartwell)

Action: HB 670 received a Do Pass by the House Juvenile Justice Committee. (2/8/17)

<u>HB 673 - Motor vehicles; prohibit actions which distract a driver while operating a motor vehicle; provisions</u>

Sponsor: Rep. John Carson (R – Marietta)

Action: HB 673 received a hearing by the House Judiciary Non-Civil Reeves Subcommittee. (2/5/18)

HB 683 - Supplemental appropriations; State Fiscal Year July 1, 2017 - June 30, 2018

Sponsor: Speaker David Ralston (R – Blue Ridge)

Action: HB 683 was passed out of the House with a vote of 167-8. (2/6/18)

HB 704 - Civil practice; burial of construction waste or materials; change when statute of limitations shall accrue for certain actions

Sponsor: Rep. Michael Caldwell (R – Woodstock)

Action: HB 704 received a Do Pass as amended by the House Judiciary Civil Fleming Subcommittee (2/7/18); and, received a Do Pass by Substitute from the House Judiciary Civil Committee (2/8/18).

HB 705 - Magistrate courts; jurisdictional limits for certain civil claims; increase

Sponsor: Rep. Trey Kelley (R – Cedartown)

Action: HB 705 received a Do Pass from the House Judiciary Civil Kelley Subcommittee (2/7/18); and received a Do Pass by Substitute from the House Judiciary Civil Committee (2/8/18).

HB 732 - Crimes and offenses; trafficking an individual for sexual servitude; provisions

Sponsor: Rep. Deborah Silcox (R – Sandy Springs)

Action: HB 732 received a Do Pass by the House Judiciary Non-Civil Reeves Subcommittee. (2/5/18)

<u>HB 737 - Law enforcement; court-ordered blood tests for protection of officers who have significant exposure to HIV, hepatitis B, or hepatitis C; provisions</u>

Sponsor: Rep. Clay Cox (R – Lilburn)

Action: HB 732 received a Do Pass from the House Public Safety Committee. (2/5/18)

HB 738 - Probate courts; term for the purpose of the right to offer a will for probate; define

Sponsor: Rep. Mary Margaret Oliver (D – Decatur)

Action: HB 738 received a Do Pass from the House Judiciary Civil Fleming Subcommittee (2/5/18); and, received a Do Pass from the House Judiciary Civil Committee (2/6/18).

HB 763- Education; student attendance protocol committees to school climate; expand
