

WEEKLY LEGISLATIVE REPORT

March 1, 2019

<u>legislation.georgiacourts.gov</u> Week 7 (Legislative Days 21-25)

The seventh week of the 2019 Legislative Session was busy throughout all five days. Legislators returned to the Capitol on Monday, February 25, for Legislative Day 21. Both chambers remained in session for the entire week and committees worked long hours to pass out bills as Crossover Day (LD 28) nears.

Several bills affecting the judiciary progressed through committee and on the floor this week. HB 92, which would allow municipal court judges to request up to six excess annual training hours be carried over to the subsequent year, passed out of the Senate Special Judiciary Committee on Tuesday, February 26 (LD 22). HB 381, which makes updates to the child support guidelines, was passed out of the House Judiciary Civil Welch Subcommittee on Thursday, February 28 (LD 24) and passed the full House Judiciary Civil Committee on Friday, March 1. HB 257, which updates and modernizes various provisions relating to magistrate court judges, passed out of the House Rules Committee and will be heard on the House floor on Monday, March 4 (LD 26). Finally, HB 134, relating to law library funds in counties with a population over 950,000, passed out of the House on Thursday, February 28 (LD 24).

The FY 2020 Budget, HB 31, finished its way through the committee process until it was passed out the House on Thursday, February 28 (LD 24). The tracking document for the House version of the budget can be found here.

The General Assembly will reconvene on Monday, March 4 for Legislative Day 26. Crossover Day (LD 28) is next Thursday, March 7. The full adjournment resolution may be found here.

Floor and Committee Action

Legislation Supported by the Judicial Council

HB 92 - Georgia Municipal Courts Training Council; training hours completed by a municipal court judge in excess of those required may carry over to the following year; provide Sponsor: Rep. Dale Rutledge (R – McDonough)

HB 92 amends Title 36 of the OCGA to allow municipal court judges who complete training hours in excess of the annual requirement to request that up to six of those excess hours be carried over and applied to the subsequent calendar year.

Action: HB 92 received a Do Pass from the Senate Special Judiciary Committee (2/26/19).

HB 134 - County law libraries; repeal a population provision regarding the disposition of law library funds in certain libraries

Sponsor: Rep. Bonnie Rich (R – Suwanee)

HB 134 moves to repeal Code Section 36-15-11 of the OCGA which provides for law library funds to be directed to the general fund in counties with a population of 950,000 or more.

Action: HB 134 passed out of House Rules (2/27/19); and passed the House 168-0 (2/28/19).

<u>HB 257 - Council of Magistrate Court Judges; organization and provide for officers; increase</u> authority

Sponsor: Rep. Mitchell Scoggins (R – Cartersville)

HB 257 amends Chapter 10 of Title 15 of the OCGA to update and modernize the magistrate court statutes.

Action: HB 257 passed out of House Rules (2/27/19).

HB 381 - Child support; defined terms and terminology, grammar, and punctuation; revise and correct

Sponsor: Rep. Chuck Efstration (R – Dacula)

HB 381 moves to amend Code Section 19-6-15 of the OCGA to remove language specifying the use of imputing gross income based on a 40-hour workweek at minimum wage and to provide for cleanup and technical changes to reflect changes in Federal law, rules and regulations.

Action: HB 381 received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute from the House Judiciary Civil Welch Subcommittee (2/28/19); and received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute from the House Judiciary Civil Committee (3/1/19).

HB 492 - Property; dispossessory proceedings; require applications for execution of a writ of possession made within 30 days of issuance of the writ unless good cause is shown

Sponsor: Rep. Bonnie Rich (R – Suwanee)

HB 492 amends OCGA 44-7-55 to require that an application for execution of a writ of possession be made within 30 days of being issued, unless good cause is shown in an affidavit accompanying the application for such writ.

Action: HB 492 received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute as amended from the House Judiciary Civil Welch Subcommittee (2/28/19); and received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute from the House Judiciary Civil Committee (3/1/19).

Other Bills

HB 31 - General appropriations; State Fiscal Year July 1, 2019 - June 30, 2020

Sponsor: Speaker David Ralston (R – Blue Ridge)

Action: HB 31 received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute from the House Appropriations Committee (2/27/19); passed out of House Rules (2/27/19); and passed the House 155-13 (2/28/19).

HB 33 - Weapons carry license; extension of time for the renewal of a license for certain service members on active duty outside of the state; provide

Sponsor: Rep. Eddie Lumsden (R – Armuchee)

Action: HB 33 received a Do Pass from the House Public Safety & Homeland Security Committee (2/25/19); passed out of House Rules (2/27/19); and passed the House 148-20 (2/27/19).

HB 38 - Crimes and offenses; theft; define a term

Sponsor: Rep. Rhonda Burnough (D – Riverdale)

Action: HB 38 received a Do Pass from the House Judiciary Non-Civil Setzler Subcommittee (2/28/19).

HB 64 - Parent and child; require child welfare agencies to make efforts to determine whether a parent or guardian of a child who is the subject of abuse allegations is on active duty in the military

Sponsor: Rep. Brian Prince (D – Augusta)

Action: HB 64 passed out of House Rules (2/27/19); and passed the House 169-0 (2/28/19).

HB 70 - Guardian and ward; guardian and conservators of minors and adults; revise provisions

Sponsor: Rep. Chuck Efstration (R – Dacula)

Action: HB 70 passed out of House Rules (2/25/19); and passed the House 170-0 (2/25/19).

HB 79 - Blind persons; child custody matters; provisions

Sponsor: Rep. Carl Wayne Gilliard (D – Garden City)

Action: HB 79 received a Do Pass from the House Juvenile Justice Committee (2/27/19).

HB 113 - Motor vehicles; prohibit license and instruction permit holders from using a standalone electronic device or wireless telecommunications device while driving

Sponsor: Rep. John Carson (R – Marietta)

Action: HB 113 received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute from the House Public Safety &

Homeland Security Committee (2/25/19).

HB 118 - Crimes and offenses; transmitting a false alarm; revise offense

Sponsor: Rep. Marc Morris (R – Cumming)

Action: HB 118 received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute from the House Public Safety &

Homeland Security Powell Subcommittee (2/28/19).

HB 171 - Motor vehicles; use of mounts on windshields for the support of wireless telecommunications devices and stand-alone electronic devices under certain circumstances; allow

Sponsor: Rep. Timothy Barr (R – Lawrenceville)

Action: HB 171 received a Do Pass from the House Public Safety & Homeland Security Committee (2/25/19); passed out of House Rules (2/27/19); and passed the House 166-0 (2/27/19).

HB 174 - Motor vehicles; proper display of license plates; provide

Sponsor: Rep. David Wilkerson (D – Powder Springs)

Action: HB 174 received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute as amended from the House Motor Vehicles Driver Safety & Service Subcommittee (2/26/19); and received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute from the House Motor Vehicles Committee (2/26/19).

HB 202 - Penal institutions; commissioner of corrections to report certain information; require

Sponsor: Rep. Jesse Petrea (R – Savannah)

Action: HB 202 received a Do Pass from the House Public Safety & Homeland Security Committee (2/25/19).

HB 213 - Georgia Hemp Farming Act; enact

Sponsor: Rep. John Corbett (R – Lake Park)

Action: HB 213 passed out of House Rules (2/26/19); and passed the House 163-3 (2/27/19).

HB 217 - Crimes and offenses; employees and agents of syringe services programs are not subject to certain offenses relating to hypodermic syringes and needles; provide

Sponsor: Rep. Houston Gaines (R – Athens)

Action: HB 217 passed out of House Rules (2/25/19); and passed the House 170-0 (2/25/19).

HB 226 - Courts; additional penalty for violation of traffic laws or ordinances under Joshua's Law; extend sunset

Sponsor: Rep. Dominic LaRiccia (R – Douglas)

Action: HB 226 passed out of House Rules (2/25/19); and passed the House 162-8 (2/25/19).

HB 228 - Marriage; change minimum age from 16 to 17 and require any person who is 17 to have been emancipated

Sponsor: Rep. Andrew Welch (R – McDonough)

Action: HB 228 passed out of House Rules (2/25/19); and passed the House 158-13 (2/26/19).

HB 239 - Georgia Business Court; establish

Sponsor: Rep. Chuck Efstration (R – Dacula)

Action: HB 239 received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute from the House Judiciary Civil Kelley Subcommittee (2/25/19); and received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute from the House Judiciary Civil Committee (2/26/19).

HB 247 - Crimes and offenses; battery against a person 65 years of age or older; repeal an enhanced penalty

Sponsor: Rep. Deborah Silcox (R – Sandy Springs)

Action: HB 247 received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute from the House Judiciary Civil Welch Subcommittee (2/26/19); and received a Do Pass from the House Judiciary Committee (3/1/19).

HB 260 - Crimes and offenses; home invasion in the first degree to incorporate family violence battery; revise offense

Sponsor: Rep. Mandi Ballinger (R – Canton)

Action: No action was taken on HB 260 by the House Judiciary Non-Civil Setzler Subcommittee (2/25/19).

HB 261 - Sexual Offender Registration Review Board; change name of board; change provisions Sponsor: Rep. Mandi L. Ballinger (R – Canton)

Action: No action was taken on HB 261 by the House Judiciary Non-Civil Setzler Subcommittee (2/25/19).

HB 281 - Crimes and offenses; pimping and pandering; increase penalty provisions

Sponsor: Rep. Teri Anulewicz (D – Smyrna)

Action: HB 281 passed out of House Rules (2/28/19); and passed the House 174-4 (3/1/19).

<u>HB 282 - Criminal procedure; increase amount of time that law enforcement agencies are</u> required to preserve certain evidence of sexual assault

Sponsor: Rep. Scott Holcomb (D – Atlanta)

Action: HB 282 received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute from the House Judiciary Non-Civil Reeves Subcommittee (2/28/19); and received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute from the House Judiciary Non-Civil Committee (3/1/19).

HB 284 - Cobb County; Magistrate Court chief judge; provide nonpartisan elections

HB 285 - Cobb County; probate judge; provide nonpartisan elections

HB 296 - Superior Court of Hall County in the Northeastern Circuit; revise term of court

HB 307 - Abandoned Motor Vehicle Act; enact

Action: HB 307 received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute from the House Motor Vehicles

Committee (2/26/19).

HB 311 - State government; waiver of immunity of sovereign immunity as to actions ex contractu and state tort claims; provisions

Action: HB 311 received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute as amended from the House

Judiciary Civil Welch Subcommittee (2/28/19).

HB 316 - Elections; definitions; provide for uniform equipment and ballot marking devices

Action: HB 316 passed out of House Rules (2/25/19); passed the House 101-72 (2/26/19); and received a hearing from the Senate Ethics Elections & Voting Subcommittee (2/28/19).

Action: HB 317 received a Do Pass by Committee Substitute as amended from the Judiciary Welch Subcommittee (2/28/19); and received a Do Pass as amended from the House Judiciary Committee (3/1/19).

HB 324 - Georgia's Hope Act; enact

HB 341 - Crimes and offenses; reproduction of recorded material; update terminology

HB 342 - Motor vehicles; issuance of a traffic citation to a vehicle owner in lieu of the individual operating the motor vehicle in certain instances; provide

HB 424 - Crimes and offenses; include certain sex crimes into the definition of criminal gang activity
