FY 2010 EMS Vehicle Equipment Replacement Grants Program

The Georgia Trauma Care Network Commission has approved an EMS Vehicle Equipment Replacement Grants Program for FY 2010. Total funding for this program is limited to \$2,125,000. These funds will provide approximately 29 grants at \$73,275 each to go toward the purchase of a qualifying replacement EMS vehicle and eligible equipment. This is a grant award program. No matching funds are required.

On 18 February 2010, the Georgia Trauma Commission voted to share the application, scoring criteria, score reference documents and scoring calculator with stakeholders while grant administration and oversight issues are resolved.

Application period is not open.

Further grant guidance and final application process and procedure information will follow.

Grants Application Spreadsheet: Application spreadsheet is a Microsoft Excel[®] file. Each applying agency must complete spreadsheet and “save as” using agency name and ambulance identifying information in file name. File must be submitted electronically. A separate Excel spreadsheet is required for each EMS Vehicle Equipment Replacement Grant application submitted. Please ensure file names reflect multiple applications if appropriate.
