CCRPI Changes

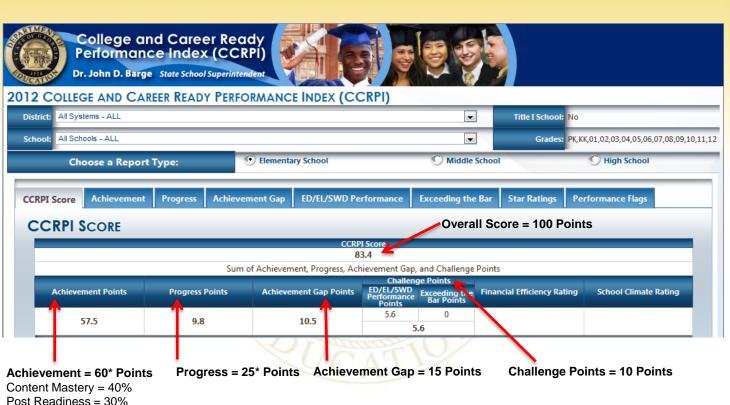
Upon the request of districts, additional data were collected which were not originally submitted in Student Record.

- The SBOE voted to ask DOE and GOSA to work collaboratively to apply the 2013 indicator modifications and calculation changes to the 2012 CCRPI data.
- This SBOE action was in reaction to concerns expressed regarding the need for districts to be able to make an "apples-to-apples" comparison between the two sets of CCRPI scores.

We anticipate a public release of the 2012 (new) and 2013 CCRPI this Monday, April 21.

2013 CCRPI Change Highlights

- 2013 CCRPI reports for schools with grades K–1 and K–2 will utilize 3rd grade ELA, Reading, and Mathematics CRCT data for Full Academic Year students.
- 2013 CCRPI reports will now display a single score for schools with non-traditional configurations (K-12, K-8, 6-12, etc.).
- Reweighting for Achievement and Progress
 - Achievement = 60 points and Progress = 25 points
- Graduation Rate
 - 2013 4-year Cohort Graduation Rate (weighted at 2/3)
 - 2012 5-year Cohort Graduation Rate (weighted at 1/3)

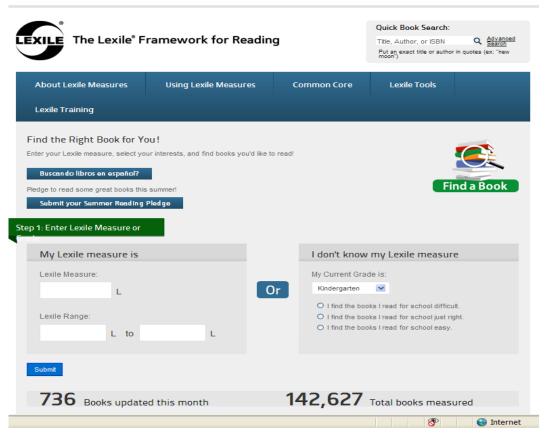

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GMAP

Comprehensive

single program, not series of tests (e.g., CRCT; EOCT; WA);
 formative assessment tools to compliment summative

Coherent

- consistent expectations and rigor to position Georgia students to compete with peers nationally and internationally
- consistent signal about student preparedness for the next level, be it the next grade, course, or college/career
- consistent signal about student achievement both within system (across grades and courses) and with external measures (NAEP; PSAT; SAT; ACT)

Consolidate

 combine reading, language arts, and writing into a single measure to align to the standards

- ✓ be intentionally designed across grade levels to send a clear signal of student progress/growth and preparedness for the next level, be it the next grade level, course, or college or career;
- ✓ be accessible to all students, including those with disabilities or limited English proficiency, at all achievement levels;
- ✓ support and inform educator effectiveness initiatives, ensuring items and forms are appropriately sensitive to quality instructional practices; and
- ✓ accelerate the transition to online administration, allowing over time – for the inclusion of innovative technology-enhanced items.

GMAP

- Grades 3 8
 - EOG in language arts, mathematics, science, social studies
- High School
 - EOC in 9th Grade Literature, American Literature,
 Coordinate Algebra, Analytic Geometry, Physical Science, Biology, US History, and Economics



GMAP will include constructed-response items and performance tasks.

Race to the Top Grants

- Grants are available to all <u>non</u>-RT3 districts!
- Funds are to be used for specific projects:
 - Participating in GaDOE ELA/Math Summer Institutes
 - Training and Development of Student Learning Objectives (SLOs)

ELA/Math Grant

Purpose:

- Pay stipends for teams of teachers to attend
 Summer ELA/Math Institutes
- Reimburse teachers for registration, travel, and lodging
- Support the implementation of CCGPS ELA/Math

- Any remaining funds may be used for districtdetermined activities that support implementation of CCGPS such as:
 - Purchasing district-selected curriculum materials, to include digital curriculum materials
 - Paying teacher stipends to redeliver
 - Hiring consultants to provide additional professional development
 - Any other district-determined activities that support implementation of CCGPS

Timeline/Access to Funds

- Budgets should be uploaded into Consolidated Application <u>now</u> for timely approval.
- Funds may be accessed after the Summer Institutes.
- Final Deadline to Access Funds: September 23, 2014

Student Learning Objectives Grant

- Purpose:
 - Support development and implementation of SLOs
 - Pay teachers stipends for developing SLOs
 - Pay substitutes

Intent to increase SLO Grant

- Purpose To provide funding to relieve district costs for first-year implementation of SLOs that may include:
 - Printing hard-copy SLO pre-and post-assessments
 - Purchasing additional management tools for current Learning Management System
 - Continuing development of SLOs throughout the school year

- Funds may be used for district-determined activities that support development and implementation of SLOs such as:
 - Paying teachers to develop SLOs
 - Paying teacher stipends to redeliver
 - Hiring consultants to provide additional professional development on SLOs
 - Printing of SLOs pre-and post-assessments
 - Purchasing software to manage SLO data
 - Any other district-determined activities that support implementation of CCGPS



Timelines/Access to Funds

- Budgets should be uploaded into Consolidated Application NOW for timely approval.
- Once budget is approved, funds may be accessed for any expenditures that occur within the grant period.
- Final Deadline to Access Funds: June 30, 2015

FY 14 Amended Budget Comments

- No changes from GaDOE Feb. 21, 2014 email (Draft) presentation
 - Midterm fully funded
 - No reductions to K-12 budget

Official Allotment Sheets posted

FY 15 Beginning Budget Comments

- No large changes to QBE or Equalization from Feb 21, 2014 GaDOE email
 - \$314 million reduced for Austerity (14.1% to 9.7%)
 - Small changes to Nursing
 - Sparsity recipients expanded (Hold Harmless)
 - Microsoft Academy funded (CTAE)
 - Charter System Grants funded
- Expect Allotment Sheets in May, following Governor's signature

GASB 67/68 Accounting Rules (All State and Local Governments)

- All LEA's in TRS will be affected by introduction of GASB 68, which will require Pension Funding Status to be shown (likely unfunded)
 - Required for FY 15 (starting July 1, 2014)
 - Does not affect General Fund
 - Non-cash, but will likely require some explanation
 - TRS has communicated draft estimates of liability
 - GaDOE and DOA will present details at GAINS and in Financial Review (GaDOE) workshops May, June
- GASB 67 affects LEA's with own pension plans

SHBP Issues

- As of now, NO increase in rates expected (for both Certificated and non-Certificated) for FY 15
- The Pre-payment process will continue through FY 14 (as per Allotment Sheets)
- No decision yet about Pre-Payment requirement for FY 2015

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
