Consequences

- Schools not achieving annual performance goals will be provided direct, on-site support from the district office
- Should the Governor's Office of Student
 Achievement and the State Board of Education deem
 a school out of compliance at the end of the five-year
 contract, the consequence will be to implement
 processes for conversion charter school status as
 required by law and rule.
