RAYMOND B. KING, President and CEO Zoo Atlanta

"A Historical Moment at Zoo Atlanta"

Raymond King joined Zoo Atlanta in 2010 as president and CEO and under his leadership, the Zoo's annual attendance has realized a more than 33 percent increase since 2010 and the zoo's fiscal condition has gone from a deficit to consistent surpluses in excess of \$1 million. He was voted "Atlanta's Most Admired Nonprofit CEO" by the Business Chronicle in 2014.

Under King's tenure are two major improvements in Zoo Atlanta's 126-year history. First is the zoo's use of the Cyclorama building and property for "A Grand New View for Zoo Atlanta: Elephants, Events and Expansion," tripling the size of the zoo's African elephant habitat. And in 2013, the zoo raised \$22 mil for "Scaly Slimy Spectacular: The Amphibian and Reptile Experience," opened last April.

Prior to Zoo Atlanta, King was with SunTrust Banks, for 22 years, most recently as SVP for Community Affairs. A community leader, he currently serves many boards including the Executive Committees of the ACVB, Buckhead Coalition and Central Atlanta Progress.

His numerous honors include Atlanta Business Chronicle's "100 Most Influential Atlantans" and Watch List of Atlanta Business Magazine's "25 Atlantans Making a Difference." A native Atlantan, King graduated from Georgia Tech. He and wife Robin have one daughter.

GEORGE N. TURNER, Police Chief City of Atlanta

Chief George Turner joined the Atlanta Police in 1981 and has worked his way up the ranks. Previously, he served as Deputy Chief of the Service and Support Division, as Major with command of the Human Resources Section and Commander of Zone One precinct. During his two-year command of the Zone One Precinct he was responsible for 17% reduction in overall crime.

During Chief Turner's career, he worked in all areas of the department to include the uniform division and investigations and has extensive experience in the area of dignitary and executive protection. He served on Mayor Andrew Young's Executive Protection Team and as the Dignitary and Security Chief while he was Governor.

Chief Turner has received numerous commendations and awards from the Secret Service and the FBI for his work on protective details with the various Presidents, other high-level officials and heads of state. He has also worked closely with the State of Georgia and other local law enforcement on a wide array of special assignments and details.

Chief Turner is involved in the community and serves on several boards. He attended Clark Atlanta and is a member of its Athletic Hall of Fame. He holds a BA in Criminal Justice from Saint Leo University and a MPA from Columbus State University. He completed the US Secret Service Academy, Small Detail Training, Police Executive Research Forum and Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police, Command College. He and his wife Cathy have four adult children.
