Founded in 1944 the community comprises 40 monks living the gospel under the guidance of St Benedict and the Cistercian (Trappist) heritage. Prior to his election, Fr. Francis served the community in a number of areas: Master of novices, Prior, Sub-Prior, Master of juniors and Director for monastic studies. He has also worked in the bonsai department at the monastery and is considered a master in growing these natural works of art.
