JAY HAKES, DIRECTOR Carter Center

"The Flap Over Fracking: The Challenges and Opportunities of America's Shale Oil and Natural Gas Revolution"

During the 1990's, Jay Hakes served as Administrator of the Energy Information Administration. In that capacity, he oversaw most of the federal government's major energy data collections and analysis. He testified before congressional committees on energy matters on 25 occasions.

Since becoming the Director of the Jimmy Carter Presidential Library and Museum in 2000, Hakes has remained active in energy affairs. In 2008, he published the book A Declaration of Energy Independence (Wiley & Sons). In 2010, he went on a two-week speaking tour of China and Singapore and later accepted a seven-month assignment as Director of Research and Policy for the National Commission on the BP Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill.

He is frequently quoted in the New York Times and other national news media on America's oil and gas resources.

Hakes began his career teaching political science at the University of New Orleans and holds a Ph.D. from Duke University.

TIM OLSEN, MD Chair of Ophthalmology, Emory University

imothy W. Olsen MD is the F. Phinizy Calhoun Sr. Professor of Ophthalmology, Chairman of the Department of Ophthalmology, and Director of the Emory Eye Center at Emory University. Dr. Olsen graduated summa cum laude, University of Kansas and then from the KU Medical Center in Kansas City.

He completed his residency training at the University of Minnesota, and Fellowship in Vitreoretinal Diseases and Surgery at Emory. He began his academic career at the University of Wisconsin, Madison and was then selected to found and direct the Minnesota Lions Macular Degeneration Center at the University of Minnesota where he became a full professor, tenure track, held the William H. Knobloch Endowed Chair from 1998-2008, and was the principle investigator for an RO-1 grant investigating proteomics in age-related macular degeneration (AMD). Dr. Olsen has received six teaching awards from three institutions. In his career, he has obtained nearly \$5.8M in research support as a Principle Investigator for macular degeneration and vision research.

Dr. Olsen serves as an executive editor for the American Journal on Ophthalmology and on the editorial board for Investigative Ophthalmology and Visual Science. He serves the American Academy of Ophthalmology as chair of the Retina Preferred Practice Pattern, Maintenance of Certification, and Practicing Ophthalmologist Committees. He is a Gold Fellow at the Association for Research in Vision and Ophthalmology, a member of the Macula Society, Retina Society and American Ophthalmological Society, and serves as a member of the Board of Trustees for the Center for the Visually Impaired. He mostly enjoys spending time with his wife, Virginia, and two sons.
