The Southern Frontier, Landscapes Inspired by Bartram's Travels

native of Augusta, Georgia, Philip Juras has long been interested in the natural landscape. He focuses primarily on remnant natural landscapes that offer a glimpse of the Southeast before European settlement. He combines direct observation with the study of natural science and history to depict, and in some cases recreate, these landscapes. The sensory impressions conveyed by his paintings invite the viewer to step through the picture plane and into the landscape beyond.

In 2011 Juras exhibited more than 60 paintings at the Telfair Academy in Savannah, Georgia, and the Morris Museum of Art in Augusta, Georgia, portraying the southern wilderness as William Bartram experienced it in the 1770s. In conjunction with the exhibit, he published the book Philip Juras: The Southern Frontier, Landscapes Inspired by Bartram's Travels. In 2012 The Southern Frontier earned Philip the Georgia Author of the Year Award in the Specialty Book category from the Georgia Writers Association.

Juras received his BFA in drawing and painting and his Masters of Landscape Architecture, both from the University of Georgia. He lives in Athens, Georgia with his wife Beth Gavrilles.
