"Atlanta Cyclorama: History and Future"

F. Sheffield Hale is President and CEO of the Atlanta History Center. Prior to joining the Atlanta History Center in 2012 he served as Chief Counsel of the American Cancer Society, Inc. and was a Partner practicing corporate law in the firm of Kilpatrick Townsend & Stockton LLP.

Mr. Hale serves as a Trustee of the National Trust for Historic Preservation, Robert W. Woodruff Library of Atlanta University Center, Fox Theatre, Inc., University of Georgia Press, the Georgia Humanities Council and is a member of the Buckhead Coalition. He is a Past Chair of the Georgia Trust for Historic Preservation, the Atlanta History Center, St. Jude's Recovery Center, Inc., and the State of Georgia's Judicial Nominating Commission.

Mr. Hale received his B.A. in History from the University of Georgia summa cum laude in 1982, and received his J.D. in 1985 from the University of Virginia School of Law.

Todd Groce, CEO Georgia Historical Society

"Flags, monuments, and holidays: Where do we go from here?"

Dr. Todd Groce is President and CEO of the Georgia Historical Society, the independent, statewide institution responsible for collecting and teaching Georgia history. Headquartered in Savannah with an office in Atlanta, it was founded in 1839 and is the oldest continuously operated historical organization in the South.

Previously, Dr. Groce was the executive director of the East Tennessee Historical Society and taught history at the University of Tennessee and Maryville College. He is the author of several books and articles including *Mountain Rebels: East Tennessee Confederates and the Civil War*. He frequently lectures on the Civil War, World War II, and other aspects of U.S. military history and has made several television appearances. For the past four years, *Georgia Trend* magazine has listed him among the "100 Most Influential Georgians."

Dr. Groce is a graduate of Leadership Georgia, and involved in several civic, professional and church groups. He earned a B.A. from the University of Memphis, and an M.A. and Ph.D. in history from the University of Tennessee. He holds a Certificate in Leadership Development from the United States Army War College. An avid outdoorsman, musician, and collector of military antiques, Dr. Groce enjoys hunting and backpacking and has hiked every major Civil War battlefield and toured dozens of other battlefields across North America, the Caribbean, and Europe.
