“The Future of the Civil Rights Legacy”

Doug Shipman is CEO of the National Center for Civil and Human Rights and was most recently a Principal in the Atlanta office of the Boston Consulting Group.

Shipman has been featured in Atlanta Business Chronicle, Atlanta Journal Constitution, Atlanta Magazine, Business To Business, Southern Voice and publications across the Southeast. He was named one of Atlanta Business Chronicle's "40 Under 40" in 2008 and one of Georgia Trend's "40 Under 40" in 2009. In 2010 New Leaders Council also named him one of their "40 Under 40".

He has an extensive educational background in issues of race, ethnicity and gender including the relationship between economics and poverty, the history of American minority groups and religion, the Indian independence movement and the Buddhist environmental movement in SE Asia. He is a frequent guest lecturer.

Shipman has served on the Boards of Easter Seals North Georgia, the Butler Street YMCA, Emory Alumni Association, Intown Academy and Harvard Divinity School. He has an MPP from the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University; an MTS from the Harvard Divinity School and a bachelor's degree from Emory.
