

KSBA Goes to Washington

School board members from across the Commonwealth and KSBA staff attended NSBA's Advocacy Institute in Washington, D.C., Feb. 2-4. The conference began Sunday with a provocative panel discussion that included proponents of education reforms such as vouchers and charter schools. The audience responded with many questions, but it was an excellent discussion from multiple viewpoints. Later that evening, author and *Washington Post* associate editor Bob Woodward spoke to the group about the current political climate in Washington.



Monday, participants spent the day preparing for meetings with the state's Congressional delegation. NSBA staff led discussions on many topics, including the messages the group should carry to Congress, and how the organizations working against public education operate.. Presenters included KSBA's Brad Hughes, who trained participants on communications.

Tuesday, participants stormed Capitol Hill to meet with their members of Congress. All members of the Kentucky Congressional delegation, except for 1st District Rep. Ed Whitfield, personally met with Kentucky school board members in the group. Pictured above is the group with 5th District Rep. Hal Rogers, and below is the group with Sen. Mitch McConnell. It was an exciting day and the participants did an excellent job carrying the NSBA message to the Kentucky delegation.

NSBA's Legislative Agenda encompasses five messages.

- Congress should restore flexibility to local school boards in the delivery of federal programs, by co-sponsoring the *Local School Board Governance and Flexibility Act, H.R. 1386*.
- Congress should increase funding for Title I and IDEA (Individuals with Disabilities Education Act) and other education initiatives to ensure our students are globally competitive.
- Congress should reauthorize the *Elementary and Secondary Education Act* (ESEA), and include local control and flexibility to implement these programs to meet the needs of local communities.

- A large formula grant program should be created to support voluntary early childhood education programs.
- Congress should make changes to certain provisions of the Child Nutrition Reauthorization Act of 2010.

KSBA received many positive responses about these concerns, and the Kentucky school board members who attended the conference did an excellent job in leading these discussions with Kentucky's Congressional delegation.

HB 170 passes the Appropriations and Revenue Committee

House Bill 170 makes changes to the collection of the gross receipts utility tax. KSBA, in partnership with the Kentucky Finance and Administration Cabinet, worked to file legislation making it easier to collect these taxes. While the legislation will not increase revenues to school districts, failure to pass it could result in future lost revenues. The legislation clarifies that non-exempt energy purchases subject to this tax are submitted directly to the Department of Revenue, instead of through the utility provider. It also clarifies the two-year statute of limitations on refund requests for all parties subject to the tax. Finally, the legislation sets a timeline for appeals when a consumer is denied a refund. Currently, the statute does not set a deadline, but this legislation will make the deadline 30 days from the notice of a refund denial.

House Education Committee Passes Key Bills

The House Education Committee approved a few key pieces of legislation during its meeting Tuesday. The committee passed HB 75, sponsored by Rep. Derrick Graham (D-Frankfort), which revamps the new superintendent training and assessment program. The bill increases the number of topics covered in the program and gives new superintendents two years to complete it.

The committee also passed HB 77, requiring the state Education Department to create a financial literacy program.

The 12 hours of instruction in financial literacy would be embedded in the curriculum throughout the school year and not be a stand-alone course. HB 77 is sponsored by Rep. Rick Nelson (D-Middlesboro). Click to view HB 77. A similar bill addressing financial literacy requires a commission be established in the Office of the State Treasurer. HB 223, sponsored by Rep. Senate Education Committee Meets

The Senate Education Committee met Feb. 6 and discussed only one bill, SB 89. SB 89, sponsored by Sen. Jimmy Higdon (R-Lebanon) allows school councils to add more rigorous curriculum standards, above and beyond the Common Core State Standards. The legislation also sets out requirements to protect student data. The bill is designed to address concerns that have been raised about student data being sold to companies to be used for research. Governor Beshear unveils tax reform package

Kentucky Gov. Steve Beshear announced his long-awaited tax reform package on Tuesday, called "Kentucky Competes."

Kentucky Competes includes 22 recommendations, most of which were discussed in the report issued by the Governor's Blue Ribbon Commission on Tax Reform. The plan features a combination of tax increases and tax breaks and is not "revenue neutral;" the estimated annual impact upon implementation is almost \$210 million. This roughly equals the state's current structural imbalance.

Beshear's proposal includes a 40-cent per pack increase in the cigarette tax, but he also would like to levy a tax on electronic cigarettes to reflect their growing popularity. The governor proposed increasing taxes on retirement income for many Kentuckians, but this does not include Social Security. The proposal also includes an expansion of the sales tax to some services, specifically, installation, maintenance and repair of taxable personal property; admissions and recreational activities; and limited commercial, residential and personal services.

At the unveiling of the plan, Beshear was flanked by Lt. Gov. Jerry Abramson, who chaired the tax reform group, and House Appropriations and Revenue Committee Chairman Rick Rand. Rand will file a "vehicle bill" to simply act as a placeholder for the plan. The bill will be empty until lawmakers reach a consensus on its provisions; the House Appropriations and Revenue Committee will begin hearings on the Kentucky Competes plan next week. The governor made it clear in his remarks that he would not put legislative members on the spot for a vote until they reach consensus. When asked if he supports the plan, Rand was quick to assert that his role as sponsor and committee chair is to simply be a facilitator for the discussion.
