ABOUT THE SPEAKERS



Dr. Leo P. Semes earned his OD from PCO and completed residency at The Eye Institute of PCO. He currently holds an appointment as Professor Emeritus of Optometry and Vision Science at UAB. Dr. Semes has authored numerous articles, book chapters and posters. He is a fellow of the AAO. Dr. Semes is a founding member of the Optometric Glaucoma Society, where he has served as Secretary and on the Executive Committee and a founding fellow of the Optometric Retina Society. In 2015 he received the Educator of the Year award from the Alabama Optometric Association. He has also been recognized with the Dean's Distinguished Service award (2016). Dr. Semes has authored and contributed to the AAO's Clinical Practice Guidelines and was recognized as among the 50 most influential in Eye Care in 2015.

Dr. Brad Sutton is a Clinical Professor at the Indiana University School of Optometry and is the Chief of Service at the Indianapolis Eye Care Center. Dr. Sutton's main areas of clinical interest include ocular disease and surgical co-management. He has given over 450 continuing education lectures on topics related to ocular disease at the local, state, national, and international level, and has published extensively. He was named the Young OD of the year in both Tennessee and Indiana, and he has served as the President of the Optometric Retina Society.



Dr. Jamie Ho is an author, lecturer, and an optometrist specializing in low vision and neuro-rehabilitation. She is a dual fellow of the American Academy of Optometry and College of Optometrist in Vision Development. After graduating from the Illinois College of Optometry (Chicago, IL), she completed a residency in community health with the New England College of Optometry (Boston, MA) prior to moving to Nashville, Tennessee.

Dr. Ashley Tucker graduated Summa Cum Laude from the University of Florida with a Bachelor of Science degree in Microbiology and Cell Science before going on to graduate Summa Cum Laude from the University of Houston College of Optometry. Dr. Tucker completed a Cornea and Contact Lens Residency at the University of Houston where she received extensive training and experience in the diagnosis and treatment of corneal diseases and in complex contact lens fits including patients with keratoconus, corneal transplants, and refractive surgery. In addition, she has earned her Fellowship from the Scleral Lens Education Society which distinguishes her as an expert scleral lens fitter. Dr. Tucker is also passionate about myopia management. She is certified in fitting orthokeratology lenses in both children and adults and has extensive experience and knowledge in myopia management. Dr. Tucker is also a Visiting Assistant Professor at the University of Houston College of Optometry.
