### Tax Deductibility Percentages:

#### **AOA**

Contributions or gifts to the AOA are not tax deductible as charitable contributions for income tax puposes. However, they may be tax deductible as ordinary and necessary business expenses, subject to restrictions imposed as a result of association lobbying activities. Ther AOA estimates that the non-deductible portion of your AOA 2013 dues - the portion that is allocable to lobbying - is 9.50%.

#### **SCOPA**

Contributions or gifts to the SCOPA are not tax deductible as charitable contributions for income tax puposes. They may be tax deductible, however, as ordinary and necessary business expenses, subject to restrictions imposed as a result of association lobbying activities. The non-deductible portion of your 2013 SCOPA annual dues - the portion that is allocable to lobbying - is 30%.


