ACA Implementation: New contracting opportunities coming for optometrists?

During health care reform implementation, health insurers and vision plans are being forced to change the way they do business to accommodate the provisions of the new law and to meet new demands from the marketplace. The changes being made are likely to introduce many new contracting opportunities for optometrists throughout the country. Most certainly, the addition of the pediatric vision essential health benefit and the resulting increased demand for children's eye care services will require many health plans to add eye care professionals, including optometrists, to their provider networks between now and the end of the year.

As we anticipate these new contractual relationships, we must remember that our interaction with a health or vision plan is governed by the terms of a contract. As with any contract, health plan and vision plan contracts are important documents for every doctor to thoroughly review and understand. These contracts set out the policies and procedures for providing care to beneficiaries, reimbursement terms and the procedures for claim submission. It is far too common that many health care providers don't actually take the time to carefully review contracts and to speak with insurance company contracting representatives to negotiate around unfavorable contract terms.

The ability to negotiate more favorable terms centers on a doctor's ability to evaluate whether the contract's terms are reasonable and fair and determine/suggest alternative terms that are more acceptable. It is imperative that you, the provider, advocate for yourself and your practice situation. As Dr. Chuck Brownlow has been known to say, "Why on earth would an insurer pay you more than you ask for?" Providers who simply accept the terms offered without even considering re-negotiating terms they find untenable are only hurting themselves and their practices.

As contracting activity in the market picks up, all optometrists should be alerted to an alarming trend sweeping the country - the narrowing of provider networks (fewer providers of each type) as a means of cutting or controlling costs. This means there will be winners and losers resulting from this more aggressive contracting activity.

The Third Party Center has recently been made aware of changes being made by EyeMed and VSP that will impact the contracting status of optometrists. We understand that EyeMed will be recontracting its entire provider network over the course of the next year with an entirely new replacement contract that, in most cases, must be accepted by optometrists who want to continue participating with EyeMed. We also know that as of January 1, 2013, VSP planned to automatically enroll all of its current Network Doctors in their new "Choice Network" which we understand will be marketed to employers as a less costly alternative (VSP Choice Plan). This is a situation where optometrists were not allowed a choice and were not allowed to negotiate the reimbursement terms for the new product/plan offering from VSP, although optometrists will be expected to accept reimbursement amounts determined solely by VSP for providing services to VSP members enrolled in the Choice Plan. The only exceptions are in those states which have state laws prohibiting "all products clauses" in provider contracts. In those states, the prohibition against "all products clauses" may apply to vision plan contracts. However, keep in mind that those state laws typically apply only to health insurers and may not always apply to those vision plans that are not actually licensed insurers in the state.

Other contract provisions and contract clauses that optometrists should be on the lookout for include:

- Clauses that are clearly discriminatory regarding access to provider panels or reimbursement terms;
- Clauses that require you to offer a discount on materials to any "member" of plan, regardless of whether you provided other professional services such as an eye exam;
- Clauses that require you to offer a discount on "non-covered services";

CONTINUED - Other contract provisions and contract clauses that optometrists should be on the lookout for include:

- Clauses that allow the company (contracting entity) to add new plans, products, and services to the agreement and force you to accept the terms of providing these additional services in order to keep your current (previously executed) contract;
- Clauses that require you to send all your lab business exclusively to one lab;
- Clauses that allow the company/plan to change the reimbursement terms at any time;
- Clauses that would allow you to be de-selected from specific products/plan offerings or placed into a particular network "tier" and/or not included in all network tiers;
- Contract provisions requiring you to join a vision plan in order to participate on a health plan's panel for providing medical eye care services;
- Indemnification clauses whereby you agree to indemnify the company/plan. These clauses introduce (via contract) additional liability that may or may not be covered by your malpractice liability carrier. If it is not covered under your current policy, you will have to add the coverage most likely at an additional premium cost to you;
- Clauses that allow the company to distinguish independent ODs from their "corporate provider base" and discriminate against certain provider types; and
- Clauses that prohibit you from initiating or joining lawsuits against company/plan.

As doctors, our focus is on helping our patients live happy, healthy and productive lives. We sometimes overlook the importance of certain terms found in provider contracts without fully assessing the impact that they may have on us. We encourage each and every optometrist to take the time to review contracts and to aggressively advocate for themselves when they feel the contract simply is not in their best interest. We also advise optometrists to seek professional assistance from their trusted business and legal advisors about any concerns or issues that may arise during a contract's review and negotiation.
