AOA's 2010 Contact Lens Hygiene & Compliance Campaign

The AOA has announced an upcoming campaign on Contact Lens Hygiene and Compliance that will be starting October 20th. More than 40 million Americans use contact lenses to improve vision but many are not following doctors' guidelines and are putting their eye health and vision at risk with bad contact lens hygiene habits. This year's contact lens hygiene and compliance campaign will serve to educate children and adults about the proper way to wear and use contact lenses, as well as caution Americans about the potential risks associated with circle lenses. SCOPA Third Party Alert - Medicaid Program

Dear Colleagues,

I am writing to update each of you on the current status of South Carolina's Medicaid Program. Due to the economic events of the last few years, there has been significant strain placed on the medicaid system. The economic recession and the state budget shortfalls of the last several years have forced the program to reach into its reserves to maintain sustainability. In addition, there has been a dramatic increase in the number of eligible individuals who have enrolled in Medicaid during the economic down-turn. All of this has placed the program in an extremely precarious situation.

Medicaid currently has \$18 million in reserves. The current projected time-line for when the program exhausts its funds is sometime around March-April 2011.

Unless something changes, it will be at this point that there will no funds for any sort of provider reimbursement. This is true for all providers.

There are multiple options that the SC Department of Health and Human Services is exploring. There is the possibility of an amended state budget that could divert more funds to the program. There is the possibility of further funds from the federal government. Also, the department is exploring different avenues to cut costs; specifically in the largest payment categories such as emergency room visits, in-patient hospitalizations, and nursing home admissions. A decrease in provider reimbursement rates is also an option. Other options include the reduction of optional services for Medicaid members. This would potentially include vision services. Every possibility is being pursued. In an attempt

to receive provider feedback, SC DHHS has placed a link on their website where anyone may make suggestions on how to help the program. The link to the website is posted below.

This is an extremely difficult time for the Medicaid program. It is a "Perfect Storm" of events. Your SCOPA board will continue to represent the profession and keep everyone informed of the changes that take place. AOA Third Party Center - S-Code Alert

We need you to alert your members and colleagues about a reemerging trend – the use of HCPCS "S Code". Optometrists play an ever increasing role as members of the primary health care team and using S Codes poses many risks for access to the full range of optometric services. For years, we have advised optometrists to steer clear of these poorly defined codes (most doctors do not realize that there is no accepted definition to the level of service necessary to report an examination using an S code), and to advocate that insurance plans utilize the health care industry standard for reporting eye and health care services, the CPT 92xxx and 99xxx series of codes.

The CPT codes have very detailed written definitions that list the tests that are expected and or structures to be examined when a specific level of service is reported. This allows for more accurate reporting of the level of service provided, based on the content of the medical record. The CPT definitions also are necessary for reporting of quality measures when billing eye care services to insurers as well as for those reviewing and or auditing clinical records.

This fact alone has far reaching implications for optometrists as members of the primary health care team and we must ensure that the services that we perform are reported in a measurable, credible, and auditable way. Further, with health care reform placing additional emphasis on quality outcomes we must remain vigilant to ensure that optometric services are included in these assessments.

We need to avoid:

- Possible segregation of providers by class (OD vs. MD)
- It is uncommon for our colleagues in medicine to report a comprehensive eye care service using an S code. Because of this, the S codes are sometimes referred to as "Optometry codes".
- There is significant risk in our profession being "carved out" of the mainstream health care system if we are to report our services in a way that is different than other providers providing the same services. Potential to classify ODs as refractionists only or to label the S code as the "optometry code"
- The S code bundles refraction with the comprehensive ophthalmological examination. This is not in concert with the mandates of the HIPAA law.

We ask that you continue to work with us to advocate for inclusion in the health care system, consistent reporting of optometric services using CPT codes and against the use of ill defined and potentially discriminatory codes to report eye care services delivered by our profession.

EHR Incentive Program Timeline

- Fall 2010 - Certified EHR technology will be available as listed on Website
- January 2011 - Registration for the EHR Incentive Program begins
- January 2011 - For Medicaid Providers, states may launch their programs if they so choose
- April 2011 - Attestation for the Medicare EHR Incentive Program Begins
- May 2011 - Medicare EHR Incentive Payments Begin
- October 1, 2011 - Last day on which a doctor can start to meet the meaningful use criteria and qualify for a bonus payment for 2011.
- Feb. 29, 2012 - Last day for Eligible Professionals to register and attest to receive an incentive payment for CY 2011.
