Statement on the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services Frequently Asked Question

The AOA is disappointed to report that the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), acting through its contractor, the National Supplier Clearinghouse (NSC), has posted an unfortunate answer to a frequently asked question about whether a doctor filling a prescription for post-cataract eyeglasses needs to obtain a surety bond to bill Medicare for the eyeglasses. The AOA and the American Academy of Ophthalmology (AAO) both maintain that the CMS position, apparently formulated at the urging of the American Society of Cataract and Refractive Surgery (ASCRS), improperly suggests that a physician cannot form a doctor-patient relationship without performing an examination or test when supplying eyeglasses to a beneficiary who first comes to the doctor's office with a prescription. The AOA is working to have CMS correct the problematic statement. The agency agreed to "consider any information" provided by AOA, but noted that "each optometrist or ophthalmologist will need to review its business model and make a determination as to whether the bonding requirements applies to them."

Optometrists remain exempt, by law and regulation, from the surety bond requirement, which Congress authorized to deter fraud and abuse in durable medical equipment, prosthetics, orthotics, and supplies (DMEPOS). Although CMS has

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acknowledged that post-cataract eyeglasses are not a fraud and abuse problem for the agency, CMS wants any business serving the general public to obtain a bond. The \$50,000 bond is required for medical supply companies by October 2, 2009 and would cost an estimated \$1,500 annually. Many optometrists received solicitations from surety bond companies and even from the NSC (Palmetto) incorrectly suggesting that optometrists were not exempt. Despite clarifying this month that optometrists are exempt, CMS has gone a step farther, without getting input from AOA, to suggest that a beneficiary who needs only to fill a prescription for eyeglasses is not a patient of an optometrist or ophthalmologist supplying the eyeglasses:

Q: How does an optometrist or ophthalmologist who dispenses eyeglasses qualify for the physician exemption?

A: An optometrist or ophthalmologist who dispenses eyeglasses can qualify for the physician exemption if the glasses are furnished only to his/her own patients as part of his/ her own service. For purposes of this exemption, a "patient" is someone who, for instance, receives an eye exam or other diagnostic test from the physician prior to receiving the glasses. The term "patient" does not include, however, a person who walks into the physician's office with a prescription for glasses that was issued by another physician and simply receives the glasses without any sort of examination or test being furnished.

The same general principle applies to an enrolled optical center owned by an optometrist or ophthalmologist. The center can only qualify for the physician exemption only if: (1) the shop and the physician's practice are under/within the same TIN [taxpayer identification number] and business structure (e.g., part of the same corporation), and (2) the glasses are furnished only to the optometrist/ ophthalmologist's own patients as part of his/her own service. The term "patient," again, would not include a person who enters the optical center with a prescription for glasses that was issued by another physician and simply receives the glasses without any sort of examination or test being performed by the optical center.
